Health Education provides students with the knowledge and skills they need to be healthy throughout their lifetime. The intent of a comprehensive health education program is to motivate students to maintain and improve their health, prevent disease, and avoid or reduce health related risk behaviors.



Comprehensive health education addresses 14 component areas under Florida State Statute 1003.42 (2)(n) Required Instruction:

K-12

- Community Health
- Consumer Health
- Environmental Health
- Family Life
- Mental and Emotional Health
- Injury Prevention and Safety
- Nutrition
- Personal health
- Prevention and Control of Disease
- Substance Use and Abuse
- Prevention of child abuse, Exploitation, and Human Trafficking

Gr. 6-12

- Awareness of Sexual abstinence as the expected standard, Consequences of Teenage pregnancy

Gr. 7-12

- Teen Dating Violence

State Statute 1003.42 Required Instruction

- (n)1. Comprehensive age-appropriate and developmentally appropriate K-12 health education that addresses concepts of community health, consumer health, environmental health, and family life, including:
 - Mental and emotional health.
 - Injury prevention and safety.
 - Internet safety.
 - d. Nutrition.
 - e. Personal health.
 - Prevention and control of disease.
 - g. Substance use and abuse.
 - h. Prevention of child sexual abuse, exploitation, and human trafficking.
- 2. The health education curriculum for students in grades 7 through 12 shall include a teen dating violence and abuse component that includes, but is not limited to, the definition of dating violence and abuse, the warning signs of dating violence and abusive behavior, the characteristics of healthy relationships, measures to prevent and stop dating violence and abuse, and community resources available to victims of dating violence and abuse.
- The health education curriculum for students in grades 6 through 12 shall include an awareness of the benefits of sexual abstinence as the expected standard and the consequences of teenage pregnancy.




